SECRETARY, SCHOOL EDUCATION

Secretary for School Education and Literacy at the Government of India, and prior to that, Special Secretary and Additional Secretary in the same Department (from March 2015 to October 2019) where I oversaw the seamless transition of the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan to the **Samagra Shiksha** covering over 1.10 million schools and 150 million students, started the **NISHTHA** programme for instructing over 4.2 million in service school teachers across the country, reinvigorated the requirements and standards for teachers by launching the **4 year Integrated Teacher Education Programme**, and handheld the discussions and advance activities leading to the **National Education Policy**.

I implemented the **Swacch Vidyalaya** initiative to provide separate toilets for girls and boys in all schools and totally reworked the **National Teachers' Awards** scheme to enable all excellent teachers to directly apply online, to show evidence of their work by uploading videos, and to explain their performance to an independent jury.

A major achievement was the bundle of initiatives to collect and compile real time data, to verify and analyse these through robust and rigorous mechanisms, predict outcomes and recommend courses of action. Thus, the **Performance Grading Index** evaluated all States and UTs across 70 indicators, guiding them to improve, and the **SHAGUN** Portal created an online repository of success stories by schools etc for easy replication,, while the **UDISE** +, for the first time, launched a sophisticated software using Big Data to collect real time information from the largest school system in the world, for which I received the SKOCH AWARD for GOVERNANCE (PLATINUM) 2019, on behalf of the Department.

Conducted negotiations with the OECD, Paris, and was instrumental in India agreeing to participate in the **PISA** assessment. Also served on the boards of the **CBSE** and **NCERT**, was chair of the **NCTE** and Vice Chair of the **KVS**.

SECRETARY, EDUCATION

Government of Delhi, Delhi

As Secretary for Education in the Government of Delhi (2005 to 2009), I created and launched the YUVA programme, an umbrella project to systematically improve the standard of government schools, containing a path breaking Adolescent Education component which introduced students to life skills for the first time in the country, including areas which had been considered taboo till then. Writing in The Guardian (August 18, 2006), Sarah Bancroft concludes that the opportunity to talk about such matters (menstruation, sex education etc) was a winner, for teachers and students. YUVA also achieved significant success in almost eliminating student suicides which were a serious cause for concern at the time. The overall project, comprising other elements such as capacity building and institutional reforms, was hugely successful in bringing about a massive transformational change in all areas, particularly in the results in national level assessments and in revisualising the school building's physical infrastructure to turn it into a tool for learning (called BaLA, ie Building as Learning Aid). These successes received BHAGIDARI AWARDS from the Chief Minister, Delhi.

MANAGING DIRECTOR, DELHI TOURISM AND TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION (DTTDC)

I organised the DELHI CELEBRATES 2010, a two month long cultural festival where over 5,000 artists and performers from every part of the country participated. Its unique feature was that almost every art form in India was represented and even unsung or unknown artists performed side by side with some of the most well known ones, and the event thus created an opportunity to revive and promote living heritage.

SECRETARY, WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT

In my capacity as Secretary, Women and Child Development (February 2001 to December 2003) I pioneered the landmark **Goa Children's Act in 2003** to protect all children from abuse, particularly sexual abuse and exploitation such as paedophilia, and entitle them to additional rights with state support. This was the first legislation of its kind in the country, and today every State and UT has Children's Commissions and exclusive Courts for adult offenders, just a few of the unique features of this path breaking Act. It paved the way for the passing of the POCSO (Protection Of Children against Sexual Offences) Act at the national level nine years later.

I was responsible for furnishing the State's responses and working with the Planning Commission and the INDIA TODAY group in the first definitive ranking of quality of life and work across India, and played a major part in the ranking by that magazine of Goa at number one in the country, that is, the Best State.
